

The Hackettstown Recreation Commission convened in open session in the Community Center at 293 Main Street, Hackettstown, NJ at 7:45 PM on July 1, 2019. Chairperson Robert Salus announced that this meeting was being held in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act by:

- (1) Posting an annual notice schedule on the bulletin board in the lobby of the Municipal Building;
- (2) Causing the annual notice schedule to be published in the Daily Record and New Jersey Herald;
- (3) Furnishing an annual notice schedule to anyone requesting such notice;
- (4) Filing an annual notice schedule with the Hackettstown Town Clerk.

John Mandick made a motion to approve the minutes of the June 17, 2019 meeting as submitted; Brian Feeney seconded the motion.
All were in favor.

Frank Galka made a motion to approve the bills as submitted; Bill Baker seconded the motion.
All were in favor.

John Mandick made a motion to approve the following bills: Verizon for Pool Service in the amount of \$60.97, Code Green Lawn Care for Fertilization in the amount of \$4,555.00 and Code Green Lawn Care for Fertilization in the amount of \$1,455.00; Brian Feeney seconded the motion.
All were in favor.

Director, Joe Yapaola reported the status of the Fall sports sign ups.

Joe informed the Commission that the Field Hockey Tournament that was held as a fundraiser on June 29, 2019 was well organized and there were no issues with parking.

Joe informed the Commission that a large tree fell at Riverfront Park and snapped a utility pole near the maintenance building that closed the park for a few hours and thanked the Department of Public Works for their assistance in clearing the debris.

Frank Galka made a motion to approve the special event license application for Joan Knechel Cancer Center to hold a Color For Cancer Run on September 28, 2019 at Riverfront Park and a special event license for NORWESCAP to hold a 5K the first weekend in November at Riverfront Park; Bill Baker seconded the motion.
All were in favor.

Joe informed the Commission that he received a request from Lauren Corydon that the Commission allow families from the Domestic Abuse Center to come to the pool with a chaperone, to charge no fee and give badges to the organization to use so the families cannot be linked to the Center.

Brian Feeney addressed the condition of the fencing at Tannery Field.

John Mandick made a motion to adjourn this meeting at 7:54 PM; Bill Baker seconded the motion.
